**Safe Welcome**  
Front doors will be locked during school days from 9:15 am to 3:35 pm.  
The safety and well-being of our students is our top priority. We have a number of procedures in place designed to keep our school safe.  
Starting on September 6th our front door will be locked during the school day. All other school doors are also locked. To access the building, visitors will need to press the intercom button at the front door.  
Staff in the office will let visitors into the school. This will help us ensure that all visitors sign in at the office. Please understand that staff may not be available to answer the door immediately. If you have any questions about safety procedures, as always, please contact the office.

Please ensure your children are aware of the time that school begins so that they will be on time. Chronic lateness is very disruptive to classes and late students miss important information.

## Procedures to Help Keep our School Safe

The safety and well-being of students is our top priority. We have a number of procedures in place to keep our school safe. You can help your child understand and feel safe by:

- talking to them about the situations below
- reminding them that emergencies are rare
- telling them it's important to follow staff instructions in these situations

Parents should talk about the following emergency drills with their children:

**Shelter in place** is used when there is an environmental or weather-related situation, like a chemical spill outside the building, or a major storm. Activities continue inside the school. Students and staff are not allowed to leave the building. The ventilation system may be shut off.

A **hold and secure** is used when there is a situation in the community, not related to the school, like a bank robbery nearby. Activities continue, but all doors are locked. No one is allowed to enter or exit the school.

A **lockdown** is used when there is a major incident or a threat of violence related to the school. Students and staff move to secure areas, away from doors and windows. Doors are locked, lights are shut off and blinds are drawn. Students and staff remain quiet. We practice lockdown drills at least two times per year. In the unlikely event of an actual lockdown situation, police ask that parents do not go to the school. Information will be communicated through the school board social media sites ([www.facebook.com/SCDSB](http://www.facebook.com/SCDSB) and [www.twitter.com/SCDSB\\_Schools](http://www.twitter.com/SCDSB_Schools)) and website ([www.scdsb.on.ca](http://www.scdsb.on.ca)), through local police and local media.

- All schools have **evacuation plans** in case of gas leaks, bomb threats or fire incidents that would require everyone to leave the school. Each school has an evacuation site. Ours is *Bradford District High School*. We hold drills to practice our evacuation plan. In a real evacuation, students and staff may go to the evacuation site, depending on the situation. Parents will be informed about pick-up procedures by the school, school board and local media.
- Elementary school main doors are locked during the school day. Visitors must use the **intercom system** to enter the building. **Staff may not be available to answer the door immediately, please be patient.** All visitors, including school volunteers, are required to **sign in** at the school office and wear **visitor identification**.
- Staff and volunteers must complete a **criminal record check** before having contact with students.
- We ask parents to contact us when their child will be absent from school as part of our **Safe Arrival** program. When we don't hear from a parent/guardian, and a student is absent, we will call home to find out the reason for the absence.
- At least two staff members in every school are trained in **first aid and CPR**. All Simcoe County District School Board schools **have Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)**.

When parents are at school during a drill or emergency event, they must follow direction from school staff, police, fire and/or emergency personnel. Parents may not have immediate access to their children during drills or emergencies. They may need to wait until the situation is resolved and school staff and/or emergency personnel release students into parent care.

It's important for you to know we'll always take whatever precautions are necessary to keep our school and students safe.

## New Student Dress Code

**There are lots of ways to dress for school: Learn about the new student dress code**

The SCDSB is introducing a new student dress code this school year. The dress code was developed in consultation with staff and students. Students are expected to respect the guidelines when dressing for school. Our school is a safe space. We work to be equitable and inclusive, and understand that students may choose to express themselves through their clothing choices. Student clothing cannot pose a safety concern or conceal identity. Exceptions are granted to students who wear head coverings or other garments/objects for the purposes of religious observance, medical or sensory needs, or other reasons protected by the Ontario Human Rights Code.

## Parking Lot

Our parking lot is very busy especially at arrival and dismissal time. For everyone's safety we encourage parents who have students in the busing areas to please take the bus to and from school and that walking students walk to and from school. The parking lot will be closed between 8:30 to 9:30 AM and between 3:00 to 4:00 PM. There is no parking other than in the designated parking areas. Only school vehicles (school buses and vans) or emergency vehicles (ambulances/police cars) are allowed in the school bus loading zone that is located directly in front of the school.

## School Grounds are Smoke Free 24/7

**The Health Unit would like to remind everyone that school grounds are smoke free 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.** Protect yourself and your children from the health hazards of second hand smoke. Remember, it is against the law to smoke ANYWHERE on school property at ANY TIME. This included smoking in your vehicle while picking up or dropping off students. It is also against the law to smoke or hold lit tobacco in a vehicle carrying anyone under the age of 16. The fine for ignoring the law is \$250.00. ## Agendas

Each student (Grades 1 to 8) will receive a SCDSB agenda. This is a very valuable tool for tracking important school events, homework assignments and provides excellent communication between home and school. Please read the SCDSB insert inside the front pages of the agenda. This document contains important information that you and your child should review. We have provided every Kindergarten student with a photocopy of this document as they will be using courier bags for communication.



## Safe Arrival

If your child will be absent/late please call the school's safe arrival line at 905-778-2010 and press 1. Leave a message with your child's name (spelling the last name), teacher, date of absence and the reason for the absence. This is a 24 hour machine where a message must be left if your child will be absent or late. If your child is absent for 3 or more consecutive days please send a note. Please do not leave an e-mail or voice mail with your child's teacher. Every new student will be receiving a magnet with the safe arrival phone number on it. Please put this near your phone or home communication area for easy access.

## Signing IN/OUT at the Office

Any late students are required to sign IN at the office and receive a late slip before going to class. If you are picking your child up early please send a note to your child's teacher. Student's cannot be picked up between 3:15 and 3:35 as the staff is busy ensuring students are dismissed safely. All student's must be signed OUT in the office by an adult on their emergency list.

## Lost or Damaged Materials

Fieldcrest Elementary School has been able to purchase many new learning materials over the last few years. We expect all of our students to respect school computers/ipads, text books, library books, supplies, furniture and property. If any property is destroyed or vandalized, we expect our students to pay the cost required to replace them. If school property is lost, we also expect our students to cover the replacement costs. Similarly, if a student destroys supplies, furniture, or property on purpose, we expect our students to replace these on their own. We are very hopeful that all of our students will respect all school property and materials so that they are not required to replace them at any time throughout the year. ## Anaphylactic Students In Our School (Severe Allergies)

It is vitally important that we have the co-operation of all students and parents in maintaining a safe environment for the many students in our school who have allergies to peanut and tree nut products. To some of our students, this is a life threatening issue. Those with a severe allergy can be sent into anaphylactic shock from the smell of peanut butter, or through the touching of a desk or door handle on which there is a trace of peanut/nut oil. Please keep all students safe by sending your child with peanut/nut free snacks and lunch.

## Student Accident Insurance

Student injuries at school, during school events, and extra-curricular activities (athletics, clubs, and out-of-province/out-of-country field trips) are not covered by the Board or its insurance company. While every precaution is taken to provide a safe learning environment, accidents can and do happen.

Due to recent injuries in Ontario during school extra-curricular activities and field trips, and the resulting financial cost, a risk exposure to school boards and families has been highlighted. It is essential that all those participating in extra-curricular activities have adequate insurance coverage for all instances of injury.

The Simcoe County District School Board has selected Old Republic Insurance Company of Canada as an option for students/parents/guardians to consider with regards to purchasing student accident insurance coverage for the upcoming school year.
